Voice 21 is the national oracy education charity. We exist to empower every child to use their voice for success in school and life. Our work transforms learning and life chances through talk by increasing access to a high-quality oracy education for those that need it most.

Over the past five years, Voice 21 has grown from operating in a single school in London to a national organisation, with a network of over 600 schools across the country. We are now embarking on our new five year strategy which aims to deepen our impact on outcomes for this generation of children and young people and those to come by significantly increasing the number of Voice 21 Oracy Schools in areas of high need and mobilising a movement of teachers and schools. To help us achieve this, we are recruiting for a number of new roles designed to enable the organisation to reach and support more schools, improve our ways of working and deliver our ambitions.

Role purpose

Voice 21 Oracy Schools is a complex whole-school intervention which empowers schools to provide their students with a high-quality oracy education. Our approach is layered, engaging both teachers and leaders in order to secure whole-school impact. As we grow our reach to over 800k students in 1900 schools by 2025, we are looking to further develop the content and resources we

provide to teachers in our schools to better support them to implement oracy in their settings, transforming outcomes for students in our target population.

The Educational Content Producer will drive our content and resources strategy, ensuring teachers and leaders in Voice 21 Oracy Schools are equipped to put oracy at the heart of their practice. This will include leading on the development of the Voice 21 Exchange, our online learning platform which is the foundation of our offer to schools, as well as developing engaging resources which support schools to prioritise and embed oracy.

- Supporting the planning and execution of our events programme for Voice 21 Oracy Schools.
- Ensuring our resources and professional learning materials are accessible and inclusive, as well as fit for purpose for both online and in-person delivery.
- Curating Talk on Tuesday, our weekly newsletter which provides practical ideas, resources and inspiration to schools in our network.
