




Become an International Oracy Leader!

We are Voice 21, the oracy education charity

We believe that all students should be empowered to find their voice for success in school and in life.

We're on a mission to transform the learning and life chances of young people through talk.

We work with teachers and school leaders, equipping them with the oracy expertise and resources to transform their classroom practice and school culture.

Our work is not about one off competitions, short term interventions or extra-curricular clubs but the sustained and comprehensive commitment to verbal literacy in every classroom, so that all students can find their voice.

Our story

We were established in 2015 at School 21, an all-through state school in East London, after a successful pilot with the Education Endowment Fund saw promise in our approach to oracy education and its impact on students' speaking and listening skills and academic engagement.

Since then, we have grown a national and international profile, working with over 7000 teachers, becoming an independent charity with a mission to ensure all students receive a high-quality oracy education.


Having had the privilege of supporting and learning from thousands of teachers, we have been able to further strengthen our approaches and understanding of what works from early years all the way through secondary school education.






The State of Speaking in our Schools

Our first report which highlighted the lack of professional development for teachers interested in, and committed to, oracy education. The report established the case for oracy in the UK education system and called for educators to get talking in class.



Transform teaching and learning through talk: The Oracy Imperative

Our book, written by two of our Directors, Alice Stott and Amy Gaunt, blends academic research and evidence, with first-hand classroom experiences and practical strategies. Challenging teachers at any stage in their career to think deeply about how to integrate oracy into their own practice.



The Oracy Benchmarks

The Oracy Benchmarks identify and exemplify the active ingredients that make a high-quality oracy education. As our guiding framework, which is the result of years of research and experience working with schools nationally, they are integral to the support we provide to Voice 21 Oracy Schools.



The impact of a high-quality oracy education

Oracy is our ability to articulate ideas, develop understanding and engage with others through spoken language and listening.

In school, oracy is a powerful tool for learning; by teaching students to become more effective speakers and listeners we empower them to better understand themselves, each other and the world around them.

Evidence suggests that improving the quality of classroom talk has a measurable impact on academic attainment, boosting retention of subject-specific knowledge, accelerating vocabulary acquisition and developing students' reasoning skills.

However, the benefits of oracy also extend beyond the classroom, supporting the development of students' confidence and self-esteem. The oracy skills acquired by students at school are also prized in the world of work; good grades and qualifications may get a candidate to interview but it will be their performance there that lands them the job.





Programme design

Our International Oracy Leaders Programme consists of three key components - practical application, expertise and leadership - which ensure that you have the relevant knowledge, skills and tools to ensure students across your school find their voice for success in the classroom and beyond.

Laura Lester-Binney is a Programme Lead at Voice 21. Within her role, she supports teachers and school leaders, across primary, SEND and secondary settings to embed a high-quality oracy education. Laura has a passion for enhancing classroom practice: embedding a foundation for oracy within the classroom through setting high expectations, valuing every voice and explicitly teaching oracy in order to elevate subject knowledge and learning. Before joining Voice 21, Laura was a teacher, and leader, in the primary sector for over a decade. She has experience leading teaching and learning, KS1, KS2, English and Mental Health and Wellbeing. Prior to teaching, she worked as a learning mentor with post 16 students, and as a drama practitioner: supporting young people and vulnerable adults with learning disabilities to find their voice.

Outcomes for participants

The International Oracy Leaders programme will enable you to become an expert practitioner in oracy. You will:

- Understand what it means to provide a high-quality oracy education at a classroom and school level
- Critically engage with the research underpinning oracy
- Plan whole-school change and evaluate impact
- Be part of a global network of expert oracy practitioners, supporting each other and sharing tips via a dedicated virtual learning environment
- Gain the resources and skills to support other teachers to develop their oracy practice
- Resources to support you to cascade training in your school

Benefits for your students

The evidence shows that speaking and listening skills underpin so many facets of school life, from attainment to wellbeing, literacy to life chances. Providing a high-quality oracy education to your students is linked to:

- Improved academic outcomes
- Increased confidence
- Improved social and emotional wellbeing
- Skills for thriving in life beyond school, particularly further study and career prospects

By the end of the programme your students will:

- Understand what underpins good oracy skills and how they can improve their own
- Be confident navigating a range of contexts for talk
- Effectively engage in oracy approaches to aid their learning
