Oracy is the ability to articulate ideas, develop understanding and engage with others through spoken language.



Oracy skills are vital to success in school and in life.

Spoken language skills are one of the strongest predictors of a child's future life chances. Children with better spoken language skills are happier, have greater confidence and achieve more. On leaving school, they are less likely to suffer mental health difficulties, more likely to thrive in further and higher education and have better job prospects.

And yet, unlike literacy and numeracy, oracy is rarely explicitly taught and developing these essential skills is left to chance in our education system. This disadvantages children from low income families who start school up to 17 months behind their more advantaged peers in spoken language development. A gap which widens as they move through school.



In the EEF Teaching and Learning Toolkit, oral language interventions are ranked joint-second in terms of impact on student outcomes. They are deemed very high impact for very low cost, based on extensive evidence.



Young people with good communication skills are less likely to have mental health difficulties.1



Speaking and listening skills are critical foundations for reading and writing.²








