Oracy in education: Why it matters and how we make it happen for every child from every background.

Ask people whether they think literacy or numeracy are important and they'll say "Of course!". Ask them about oracy and you may get a more hesitant response, or an embarrassed silence. Yet oracy underpins our ability to learn, to interact, to express our thoughts and feelings, to engage meaningfully in the richness of human life. In announcing the new independent Commission on the Future of Oracy Education in England, chair Geoff Barton will outline the aims of the commission and some of his hopes about the impact it will have.

In this session we explore the causes behind, and impact of, exclusion with The Difference. You'll hear from a London-based Pupil Referral Unit about the positive impact of oracy education on their students, and consider what this means for students who remain in mainstream education.

Oracy for voice, identity and wellbeing: how can oracy contribute to personal development and communal connection at school and beyond?

In this interactive workshop you will be invited to think collaboratively and imaginatively about 'language' and 'oracy', how these terms relate to children's personal development and how they can be used to establish a sense of belonging and to nurture community relations. You will be presented with some research-informed insights into children's experiences of language, and you will be invited to reflect on such perspectives as you collaboratively develop an oracy manifesto to inform your practice.
